Learning skills: concentration, fine motor, language skills, creativity, and coordination.

Construction (soft linking)

Learning skills: developing great balancing skills, gross motor, patience, coordination, classification counting, and colours.

We also played simple game with the children to make them feel part of the group and to establish and maintain respectful, trusting relationships with them like 'who is under the rug', which all the children enjoyed.
