## Counting pebbles and dots on the logs:

Pre-schoolers showed interest in counting pebbles using one to one correspondence. They also placed the pebbles on the number chart from 1 to 10 . While counting as they placed the pebbles on the matching spoken number. They also counted the number of dots on the logs using one to one correspondence. The older pre -schoolers were able to recognise and name all the numbers on the chart, some younger preschoolers repeated the number names along with the educator.

## Phonics awareness

This week, the children listened to sound associated with letter $G$ and $F$ on the you tube video. They were able to recognise and repeat the hard and soft sounds made by letter G. Ms Sh explained that G makes two types of sounds like in girl, gate which is different from the soft $G$ sound in giant and giraffe.

Learning Area: phonics awareness skills, developing oral literacy skills, recognising and naming alphabets


## Writing Numbers

This week, the pre-schoolers are showing interest in writing numbers. $S a, A s, N c$ and $O j$ requested $M s K$ to make a paper wallet and paper money. Ms $K$ encouraged them to make money by copying the numbers from the number chart. Oj, As and Sa showed persistence in copying the numbers to make money for their wallets.
$J j$ and $L a$ were able to recall and write the numbers from 1 to 10 in order without copying.

## Reading Number book

Yo showed interest in reading the number book. Ms $K$ named the numbers as her pointed to them.
$M s$ Su read the number book to $Z G$ and $O$. The educator encouraged them to recognise the number by asking simple questions, so they could point to the numbers and repeat the number names
