

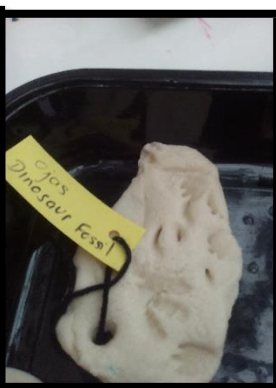

Learning about dinosaurs

The preschool children are showing interest in playing with dinosaurs and reading books about dinosaurs. The older pre-schoolers know most of the names and even which dinosaurs are herbivore or carnivore. They share their knowledge and views with each other while reading dinosaurs books.

Learning area: literacy skills, peer – interaction, learning from peers, developing awareness that print conveys meaning



Making Dinosaur fossils using salt dough

The preschool children had opportunity to make dinosaurs fossils after watching the video about how fossils are formed. The children rolled the salt dough with the roller, then made dinosaur impression on the dough to make fossils. After watching video, *La, Ni, Oj and W* were able to explain how the fossils are formed.

Learning area: fine motor coordination, enhancing vocabulary, learning the concept of fossil, visual literacy skills

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Creative constructions

The preschool children are using their imagination and real-life experiences to create constructions using various materials like legos, wooden blocks, mobilos etc. *Ni* used wooden blocks and legos to create his own house with a lego blue coloured swimming pool with a yellow border. *Sa* also worked for along time to create a two-storey building that represented her house. *Di and Ap* worked collaboratively to create a two-storey house.

Learning Areas: spatial awareness, working collaboratively, fine motor coordination, creative thinking
